

Zone 8 AWG Team Trials – December 13, 2025,

2026 Alberta Winter Games Cold Lake, AB February 13-16, 2026

Weigh-Ins: At home, Coach supervised, on Wednesday, December 10, 2023,
***1 kg weight allowance on all weight challenges**

Skin Check: Coaches, please ensure your athletes are free from skin ailments such as ringworm. Any athletes found to have a skin infection, such as ringworm, will not be permitted to wrestle.

Eligibility:

- *Male and Female athletes born in 2011, 2012, and 2013
13-15 years of age by December 31, 2026,
- *All athletes of the correct age and weight may participate
- *Athletes may compete in their zone of residence or a zone where they are a club member; however, they must declare their zone of choice before competition.

Weight Classes (kg):

Female: 39-42, 46, 51, 56, 60, 65, 72, 80

Male: 34-37, 40, 43, 47, 51, 55, 60, 65, 70, 76, 83, 83+ (95 max)

Trial Competition Date: Saturday, December 13th, 2023

Time: 10:00 am – Completion

Location: Roland Michener Secondary School

Tournament Format: will be round-robin. Groups of five or fewer athletes will be placed in a single pool. Groups of six or greater will be split into two pools. The top two wrestlers in each group advance to crossovers. The winner of Pool A wrestles the second-place wrestler in Pool B. The winners of these matches compete for 1st and 2nd. The other two athletes compete for 3rd and 4th.

Registration Fee: \$30.00

Zone 8 Athletes: Mandatory Team meeting following trial completion.

***Must be a member/registered with AAWA before trials.**

How to Complete the Registration Process

1. Go to the Alberta Winter Games web page: www.albertawintergames.ca
2. Click on “**Sports Information**” to access registration for an **ATHLETE, COACH, OR MANAGER/CHAPERONE**
3. The page like below will generate. Note: This area contains links to access Participant Registration, Technical Officials Registration, the Administration Login and technical package for each sport in the Games

Click on “**Register Here**” below the icon of their Sport.

A personal information page will be generated. Participants must fill in all fields on the online form – completed Waiver of Liability & Release Form upload, sport-specific, personal, and health/medical information

PARTICIPANT (ATHLETES, COACHES, AND MANAGERS/CHAPERONES) REGISTRATION

- All **PARTICIPANTS** must download/print, properly sign, and upload an **Alberta Games - Waiver of Liability & Release Form** as part of the registration process in the Alberta Games (accessible when you register, or available at www.albertawintergames.ca under “Forms/Resources”).
- Alberta Games athletes are under 18 years of age, therefore a parent/legal guardian must also sign the Alberta Games – Waiver of Liability & Release Form for each athlete.
- Fill in all fields on the online form; fields indicated in **Red** are mandatory (**Note: a VALID E-MAIL ADDRESS IS REQUIRED, and families with more than one Zone team member participating in Games should use separate e-mail addresses**)
- Once you’ve selected your sport, use the drop-down box to select the age category & events. In some sports, more than one event per participant can be selected.
- Head coaches – ADD your NCCP# to the registration in order to complete registration.
Bus transportation to/from the Games has been selected for all participants (Athletes, Coaches, and Managers/Chaperones). Should you NOT require transportation to/from the Games, or you live within 100 km of Airdrie, please deselect the bus transportation option.
- Once all required information is entered, click ‘**Submit**’ to register. A confirmation page will appear with all information that has been entered. If changes need to be made, it will be shown on the registration page. If the information is correct click “Submit” for the final submission.

ALBERTA GAMES CODE OF CONDUCT

The Code of Conduct identifies the standard of behavior that is required of all participants while traveling to, participating at, and returning from an Alberta Games.

ALL Alberta Games Athletes, Coaches, and Managers/Chaperones (Participants) Shall:

1. Represent your Zone team as goodwill ambassadors; with dignity and personal integrity within the spirit of good sportsmanship at all times both in and out of competition. Also, make no detrimental statements in public (radio, television, print, or electronic media) with respect to the performance of any Games or Host Society personnel and volunteers, match officials, participants, or any actions or policy decisions of the Alberta Games program.
2. Respect the:
 - Members of your own team and of the contingent representing your Zone;
 - Members of all teams competing from other Zones;
 - Rules and standards set by the Provincial Sport Organization, the Games Host Society, and Alberta Sport Connection - Mission Staff;
 - Technical officials, judges and/or referees decisions;
 - Facilities and equipment of the PSO and Games Host society; and
 - Games Host Society volunteers, staff, spectators, and local business personnel.
3. Abide by the Games Accommodation regulations requiring all athletes, coaches, and chaperones to:
 - reside in their assigned Games Accommodation (the nights of February 14 – 16, 2020); and
 - adhere to the 11:00 pm curfew set for the nights of the Games.
4. Attend the Opening Ceremonies for the Games, and wear the Alberta Sport Connection Zone identification. Zone identification should be worn during medal presentations and throughout the Games, where appropriate.
5. Avoid individual or collective behavior that may be deemed as harassment, bullying, offensive or abusive. Additionally, do not use information technology to make or post inappropriate comments which are discriminatory or offensive. Information technology includes but is not limited to, email, instant messaging, text messages, phone messages, digital images, and website postings (including social media such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Snapchat, and/or blogs)
6. No Alberta Games athlete shall possess or consume alcohol, marijuana, or illegal drug substances (as defined by the Criminal Code of Canada).
7. Furthermore, tobacco & marijuana, alcohol, or illegal drug substances (as defined by the Criminal Code of Canada) may not be possessed, nor consumed in any Alberta Games - Athletes' Village, Venue, or Vehicle.

Additionally, all Coaches and Managers/Chaperones Shall:

7. Set a positive example for their athletes by complying with all PSO and Alberta Games policies, rules, and standards of conduct.
8. Act in the best interest of the athletes, avoiding all unsafe and unacceptable circumstances. Respect the advice of certified medical personnel if an injured or ill athlete is recommended to be withdrawn from competition.
9. Supervise and be responsible for the conduct of their athletes at all times during the Alberta Games.
